In Re Philip Carr, Detention Officer

We, the members of the Career Service Appeals Board called to hear the appeal of Philip Carr in Case Number 2024-00317-OPS, over the matter of his termination from the Alachua County Sheriff's Office, make the following findings:

- 1. On October 12, 2024, Detention Officer Philip Carr, ID #1738, was assigned to work the Male Infirmary duty post at the Alachua County Jail.
- 2. The responsibilities for the Male Infirmary duty post include an observation check every fifteen minutes with a written documentation log.
- 3. Mr. Carr has worked this duty post on prior occasions and is aware of the duty assignments.
- 4. Mr. Carr did not conduct an observation between 3:24 PM and 4:05 PM.
- 5. The written documentation log created by Mr. Carr showed observations had been completed at 3:30 PM, 3:45 PM, and 4:00 PM.
- 6. Mr. Carr took responsibility for his actions at the first opportunity and never denied the above facts.
- 7. Mr. Carr began employment with the Alachua County Sheriff's Office on October 10, 2016.

Conclusions:

- 8. The violation of directive 353.V.A.6 Untruthfulness is Sustained.
- 9. The violation of directive 353.V.B.1 Performance of Duty is Sustained.
- 10. The termination of employment of Philip Carr is not sustained.
- 11. The Board has determined the appropriate sanction for Philip Carr is:
 - a. To serve a suspension from the date of termination, December 20, 2024, to present.
 - b. To be placed on disciplinary probation for one year.
 - c. Rollcall presentation related to the performance of checks.
 - d. Not assigned to the male infirmary for no less than 90 days.
 - e. Attend approved FDLE ethics class or training.
- 12. The Career Service Appeals Board for this matter is dissolved.

We therefore do not sustain the termination, and provide the above punishment, this 31st day of January, 2025.
